- www.biblegateway.com—The entire Bible in almost any language and translation at your fingertips. If your computer is so equipped, it will even read the passage to you!
- <http://bible.christianity.com/> - This website has an entire library of resources and information about the Bible.
- www.textweek.com—just go to the “scripture index” link and you will have at your disposal more information on a particular passage than you knew existed; including Wesley’s notes, references from contemporary movies and many more.

Those Names Are Important!

As you read the Bible, it’s handy to remember that nearly all the names of characters and many of the names of the places have significance. However, to realize the significance, we often need to pause in our reading and get out our magnifying glasses and read those tiny footnotes or margin notes in our Bibles. But, if we take time to do that, we often open ourselves up to deeper dimensions of the story.

Below are some examples of names and their meanings:

- Adam: in Hebrew it means both “dust” and “humanity.”
- Moses: in Hebrew it means “draw out” - remember how he was ‘drawn out’ of the river?
- Jacob: in Hebrew it is “one who butts in line” - Can you figure out why?

Questions to Consider When Reading Scripture

1. Is there an example for me to follow?
2. Is there a sin for me to avoid?
3. Is there a command for me to obey?
4. Is there a promise for me to claim?
5. What does this passage teach me about God or Jesus Christ?
6. Is there difficulty for me to explore?
7. Is there something in this passage I should pray about today?
