## **Christmas Offering to Benefit Food Bank of Alaska**

Over 1 in 11 Alaskans struggle with food insecurity. One in six (6) Alaskans do not know where their next meal is coming from. Thirteen percent (13%) of Alaskan children live in homes that may not have enough food.

During the first six months of 2023, over 23,000 households were served compared to 17,600 in 2020. In Juneau, the Southeast Alaska Food Bank set a 27-year record for food distributed in FY23, amounting to 581,500 pounds. These statistics highlight just how critical times have been this year for our neighbors in need. (Foodbank of Alaska September 2023 newsletter)

Anchor Park UMC participates in Backpack Buddies, a food program administered through the schools to feed children on weekends. In October Anchor Park sent the Food Bank of Alaska \$2000.00 to fill the gap in their funding for Backpack Buddies.

The Church Council voted to continue this support through our Christmas Even offering. The offer will be split between the unpaid number of apportionments with the remaining amount going to the Food Bank.

The people who walked in darkness have saw a great light.

For those who lived in a land of deep shadows—light! sunbursts of light!

The zeal of God-of-the-Angel-Armies will do all this.

The people that Isaiah was originally addressing in these verses had witnessed the destruction of everything they know. Every aspect of who they were and how they understood their identity had been torn down by the Babylonians, and then the Persians. To say they were a people who walked in darkness accurately described what most of them probably felt – hopeless and wondering where God was.

The above passage from Isaiah is an excerpt from a larger passage which is a promise that those who have lost everything will be restored. Not individuals, but a nation. Not for themselves, but so that the people of God may once again thrive, and so that the world may know that God has not abandoned the people.

As we prepare for Advent, we hear these words as a promise of Jesus. The light of the world comes into the darkness and the darkness does not overcome it. Those who have walked in darkness have seen a great light. But that may not be what Isaiah originally meant. Some six centuries lapsed between Isaiah and Jesus.

When Isaiah wrote this, he was working to encourage the people of God to understand that the character of God is such that in our times of distress and pain, God is present. In the days of struggle, the God of light breaks in to light our path. The character of God is the same for Isaiah, as it is for the people living in oppression and hopelessness in the first century, and for those of us living even further in time, in the 21st century.

While that which causes darkness has changed, the promise of God's presence and protection has not changed. The promise that in the darkest valleys, God walks with us. The promise has not changed that the light that has broken into the land of darkness has broken into our lives.

The promise which we hope for in the season of Advent is that the character of God continues to offer hope to the hopeless, light to the darkness, and abundant life to us all. Let's go into Advent not just looking for this hope, light, and life for ourselves, but for everyone we meet.

Amen.

They have had to have the home they owned foreclosed and auctioned off. They are in the process of legally disputing all the charges and pay garnishment, but they are having a tough time keeping up with all the expenses, including legal aid. They are currently doubled up living with another family. I believe in their strength, and I know they can get through this. They only want their kids to see this holiday as a bright spot to a really rough year."

Father, mother, girl age 12, girl age 11, boy almost 9.

### **Rogers Park Family situation**

Mom's partner and father of the children died in late September. The family is still dealing with that trauma and loss. The mom had been stay-at-home. Now, she is trying to figure out life, and how to provide for her kids now that circumstances have drastically changed.
